Page 3      A Rugged Pioneer Family

In the year 1833 only forty four years after George Washington was inaugurated as the first president of our young Republic, Emily Spindle Gayle was born. The scene of her birth was a rocky unpromising section of country near the village of Poole in Perry County Tennessee. Her parents were hard working intelligent farmers, and Emily at an early age took her share of the hard work in feeding and clothing the growing family.

In the year 1850, Emily was married to Wiley Bennet Tanner and to this union were born three children, William Mathew in 1851 James Wiley in 1853 and Susana Caroline in 1856. In the following year great sorrow overshadowed the home by the death of the first-born son William and the husband and father Wiley Bennet Tanner.

With the splendid courage for which our pioneer ancestors were noted Emily accepted the challenge of caring for her two fatherless babes. In 1860 she was married to Michael

Kachelman and to this union five children were born; Martha Ann 1861, John Alexander 1864, Florence 1867, Samuel Joseph 1871 and Harve Alonzo 1875.

In 1870 James Wiley Tanner age 17 married Katherine Strickland, a son William Andrew was born in 1871. The marriage did not prove a happy one and James was granted a divorce and the custody of the child.

In 1875 Emily and the Tanner family suffered a great hour of sorrow when Susana a lovely young lady of nineteen years was taken in death.

During the years from 1870 - 74 were trying times for law abiding citizens. Night riders and brigands were a constant menace, on one occasion a brigand and one of his accomplices entered the Kachelman home demanding food.

Emily faced the hoodlums courageously, insisting that she did not have enough food for her own hungry children. The intruder paid no attention to her plea but rummaged through the cupboard and found a cake of Maple Sugar which the family used for sweetening tea and coffee.

Emily's eyes blazed as she faced the hoodlums.  
"Have you no shame," she demanded, "will you  
take the last morsel from my starving children?"  
The intruder hesitated for a moment: then breaking  
the lake over the back of a chair he handed the  
brave mother one of the parts and slunk from  
the house followed by his accomplice.

The violence in the community increased until  
it finally became unbearable and finally in  
1877 she led her family to northern Alabama  
where they lived until 1880 in the town of Florence

In 1880 the family began to hear reports  
of the U.S. government's giving free land to persons  
interested in taking out claims to a quarter section  
of land and living on it for a certain period of time  
at this time Emily decided to cast her lot with  
her Tanner and Kachelman children in west  
central Kansas. On Feb 26 1880, her family  
in Great Bend Kansas. Immediately afterward  
Emily and oldest son James took claims and  
settled upon homesteads in Allans Township in  
Stafford County.

As soon as each of the Kachelman boys came  
of age she settled on a homestead and began to  
build improvements. The crops being uncertain

and grasshoppers a constant threat it was <sup>Report</sup>

necessary to find employment off the farm. The boys even before coming of age drove ox teams and wagons to haul freight for the building of homes in Great Bend, Larned and St John.

They hauled freight from old Fort Larned as far south east as Leesburg and the growing Young City of Pratt. The hardships they endured including the terrible blizzard of 1886 ruined fills a book

### Family of James Wiley Tanner

James Wiley Tanner, son of Wiley Bennett

Tanner and Emily Spudde Gayle was born Dec. 5, 1853 near Pope, Tenn. and died Mar. 10, 1910 in St. John K.s. In 1870 at age 17 he was married to Katherine Strickland. To this union a son was born in 1871, William Andrew Tanner. He was given custody of this son following their divorce. Later he was married to Anna Virginia Beris of Ala. and 4 children were born to this union.

The early years of pioneering in Stafford County were filled with struggle and bitter discouragement. Grass hoppers, drought, hail and low prices for the scanty crops raised proved too much for the easily discouraged pioneers. The Tanners and Kachelmans were able to weather the hard times bought the land of the ones who gave up the struggle and returned to their former homes in the East.

James Tanner bought two quarters of land in Albion township and was gradually able to pay off his indebtedness.

In 1900, in order to give his family better educational advantages bought a home in St John and moved to the city in time for the children to enroll in the St John Schools.

James spent a large portion of his time on the farm. Crofts continued to improve as prices as well as prices and he was able to acquire more land. At the time of his death in 1910 he was the owner of nine quarters of choice farm land. He had built one of the most modern homes in St John. He had helped to organize two farm co-operatives in Stafford County also the St John National Bank of which he was a director.

He was interested in education for his family and was himself a reader of good literature. Robert Burns was his favorite poet often quoting "O wad some power the giftie gie us to see oursels as others see us" and "man's inhumanity to man make countless thousands mourn".
